Break down	Refer to the working stopped condition of the machines	We were not able to reach our destination on time as our car broke down in the mid-way.
Call around	Contacting many people at a time	Abay was calling around to identify the nearby real-estate dealer.
Come down on	Attack or punish	The court decided to come down on all those who violate the country's rules.
End up	Reaching or coming to a place, condition, or situation that was not planned or expected	Eventually the old man ended up in the nursing home.
Get around	Travel from place to place	It is always easy to get around the city on motorbikes.
Venture forth	Leaving somewhere safe or comfortable	We can venture forth on roads only after the policemen took charge of the situation.
Measure against	Judge or evaluate by comparison	You must not measure against us without knowing our true potential
Take after	Resemble like their parents	John took after his mother's eyes.
Limber up for	Prepare for work that will need great effort	People in this locality limber up for making the ends meet in spite of their financial conditions.
Tee off	Start or launch	We are looking to tee off the grand
